We continue to experience growth in our programs as we served a record number of youth and families in 2017.

Roots: Over 1,300 children and families received a safe and stable home through one of Marygrove's programs, the first important step in a young person's journey to recovery from abuse, neglect or other trauma.

Heal: Marygrove is known for being successful in assisting children who have severe psychiatric issues. 85% of clients in Marygrove's Crisis Services program moved to an improved living environment.

Grow: Our Independent Living program serves about 150 young people annually providing them with a community based program in which young adults, including teen parents, learn vital life skills that will help them become self-sufficient. Furthermore, in an effort to continue to grow as an organization and in the community, one of our future goals is to expand our Therapeutic Foster Care program in the year 2018.

MARYGROVE PROVIDES a full range of behavioral health services including:

•Therapeutic Residential Treatment:

Residential and Intensive Treatment "cottages" provide a safe and stable living environment while youth receive help to manage emotional and behavioral

Therapeutic Foster Care:

On-campus and community based foster homes where children learn to trust and engage positively in a family setting.

• Transitional Living Program:

On-campus psychiatric group homes provide a foundation of support as young adults pursue academic, occupational and other life skills that advance them toward healthy and productive adult lives.

Independent Living Program:

A community based, scattered site apartment program where young people, including teen parents, learn important skills which move them toward self-sufficiency.
