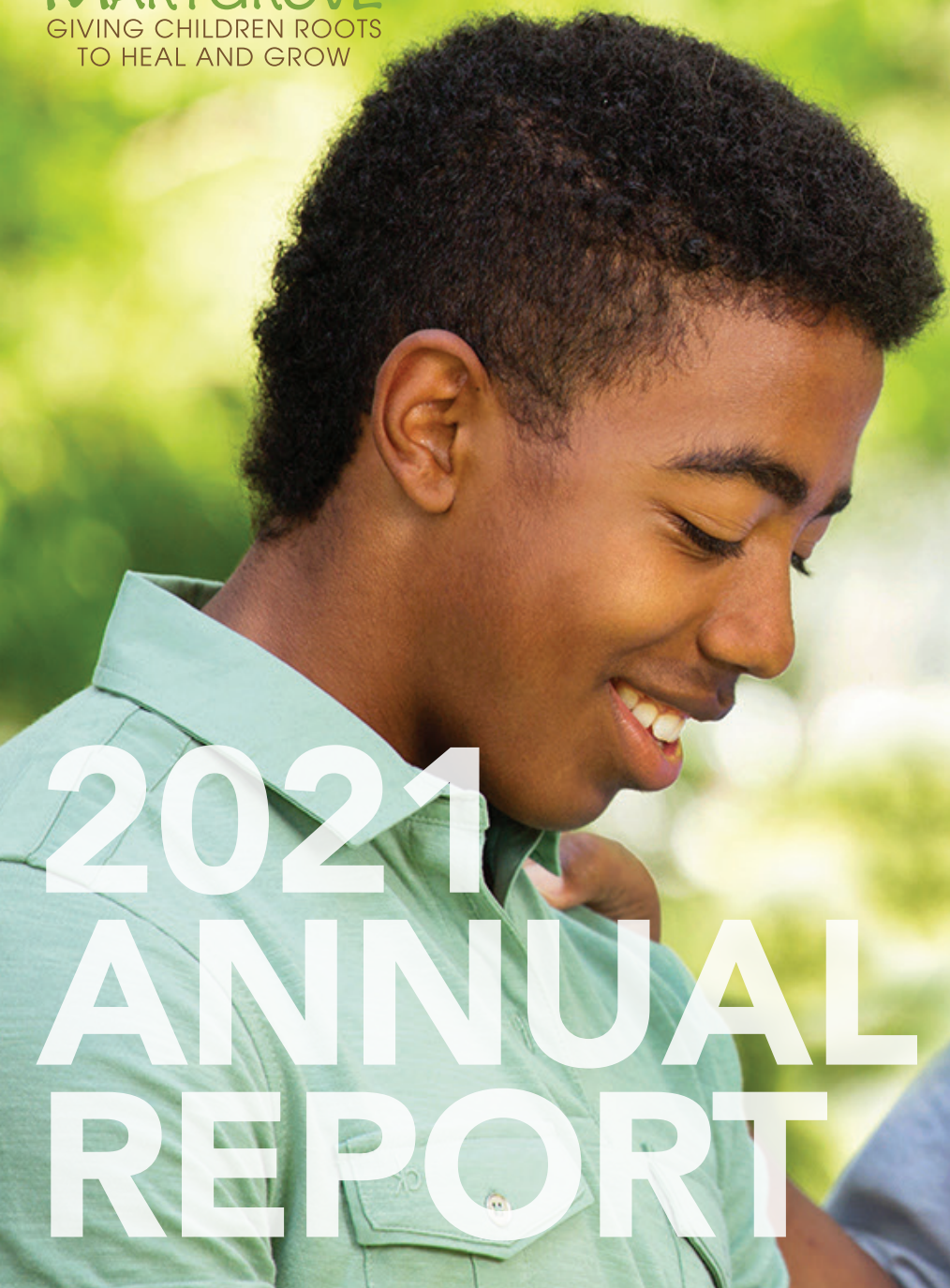

DARIA'S STORY

Daria came to Marygrove at the age of 18 in search of a brighter future. When her mother moved out of state, Daria stayed in St. Louis to finish high school. She moved in with her grandmother, but her living situation didn't turn out to be what she had planned. She was forced to move out of her grandmother's home which caused stress, resulting in her grades dropping.

Daria worked at a local thrift store and struggled to keep her job. There were times she would have to stay late and would miss the last scheduled bus of the evening. When this happened, Daria would sleep in a local park restroom until the next bus at 4 a.m. Daria had no place to go but she had drive to persevere. After learning about Marygrove through her high school counselor, she enrolled in Marygrove's Independent Living Program.

Daria soon received the care and support she needed to succeed as an independent adult. Since leaving Marygrove's Independent Living Program, she graduated high school, purchased her own home, and now has a career as a Personal Banking Specialist. Daria currently serves as an advocate for Marygrove, attending special events to share her story and the mission of Marygrove. Daria states, "A lot of things that I've accomplished in my teenage years until now has happened with the help, guidance, and support of Marygrove."

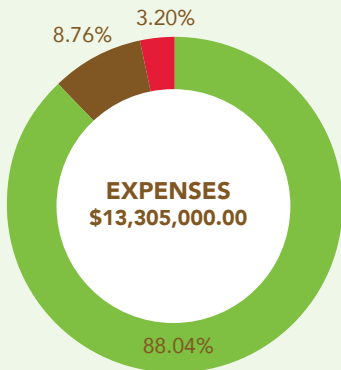

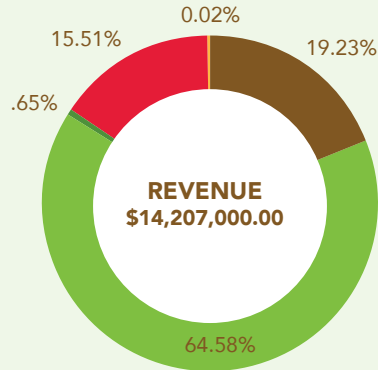
